NOTIFICATION

As per approval of the Senate on 23-11-2009, following decisions of CRC has been ratified and shall be applicable for Ph.D. programmes in all disciplines,

1. As per rules and regulations of Ph.D. programme, a research scholar has to register himself/herself in each semester. It has been resolved that the candidates shall be allowed to register as per schedule as below,

ODD SEMESTER
upto 31 August (without any late fee)
upto 31 October (with a late fee of Rs. 1000/-)
upto 31 December (with a late fee of Rs. 2000/-)

In case the candidate does not register himself/herself upto 31 December, his/her registration shall be reviewed by the DRC/CRC

EVEN SEMESTER
upto 31 January (without any late fee)
upto 31 March (with a late fee of Rs. 1000/-)
upto 31 May (with a late fee of Rs. 2000/-)

In case the candidate does not register himself/herself upto 31 May, his/her registration shall be reviewed by the DRC/CRC.

Supervisor of the candidate and the HOD concerned shall ensure to get the candidates registered for Ph.D. degree in their department as per the above schedule. This schedule shall be applicable to all categories of candidates. Late registration fee shall also be charged from those candidates who have been exempted from registration fee as per rules and regulations.

If any holiday falls on the above mentioned dates, the working day shall be considered as the last date.

(Form for registration shall be available with the chairman of the DRC)

2. Progress monitoring by the RPC & DRC is mandatory. After the completion of the every six months, the progress of the research will be evaluated by a RPC consisting of the Supervisor and Co-supervisor (if any) and two faculty members from the institute convergent with the field of research. In addition, annual progress seminar of the work shall be presented by the candidate before the DRC. In case the candidate does not submit/present his/her progress report to the Chairman of DRC in time for the consideration of the RPC & DRC, his/her registration shall be reviewed by the CRC on the recommendations of DRC.

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3. As per rules and regulations of the institute, the candidate can have a Co-supervisor from the institute and from the Institute/University/research organization of national level where the candidate wish to complete his/her part of work in collaboration with that organization, in case the facilities are not available at SLIET. It has further been decided that the DRC/CRC may decide on case to case basis on merit for a Co-supervisor for a candidate from other institute/universities in the region. The credentials of the Co-supervisors shall be checked thoroughly by CRC.
4. **Course Work for Ph.D. Candidates:** As per guidelines issued by UGC and published in Gazette of India for award of Ph.D. degree, a course on Research Methodology is compulsory for all candidates. The following committee is constituted to work out the details of the course,
- (i) Dr. S.S. Dhaliwal HOD (Maths) (ii) Dr. A.P. Singh HOD (ECE)
(iii) Dr. Rajesh Kumar AP (Mech.) (iv) Dr. Mahesh Kumar HOD (EDP)

As per rules and regulation of the institute two courses are compulsory for each candidate, if required. Now onwards one of the course shall be on Research Methodology. This course shall be offered each semester to the candidates registered for Ph.D. degree at institute level.

The schedule to conduct the examination for course work shall be announced separately. The examinations shall be conducted during the months of December/January and June/July every year.

Method of Evaluation: Written test of 3 hours duration and of 100 marks as per the pattern followed in the end semester examination of PG courses run in the institute.

The answer sheet of the candidates shall be evaluated and minimum percentage of marks to pass the course will be 50 % of the total marks. Accordingly the candidate's performance shall be declared as satisfactory/unsatisfactory by the DRC. In case the performance of the candidate is found to be unsatisfactory, one more chance shall be given to pass the course, failing which the enrollment/registration of the candidate shall be reviewed.

Option for Course Work: The candidates, who have not earlier opted to have a Course work for getting Ph.D. degree, will be given an option to pass the course work in the light of notification issue by UGC.

Each department is required to work out the details of at least five courses along with the complete syllabus for offering to the scholars in their department.

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
